


Campus and Societal Racial Climate and Injustice: Understanding Diverse Black Students' Perceptions and Lived Experiences

- Do you identify racially as Black and/or are perceived racially as Black by others?
 - Are you 18 years of age or older?
 - Are you currently enrolled in a U.S. higher education institution (undergraduate or graduate school)?
 - Have you completed at least one academic year of college in the U.S.?

If you answered "YES" to these four questions, you may be eligible to participate in the research study.

The purpose of this research study is to understand (1) how Black college students of diverse backgrounds experience and make meaning of major contemporary racial events and issues in U.S. society and (2) how they draw connections to their own Black identity and university environment and experience.

Our research team is comprised of Black faculty and student researchers who are interested in amplifying the voices of Black students in U.S. higher education as well as the similarities and diversity in how Black people experience U.S. society and higher education.

Participants will be asked to participate in a 60 to 90 minute audio-recorded interview via Zoom meeting. Participants will receive a \$20 Amazon gift card after completing the interview.
